CATECHISM

The Lord's Prayer, The Fourth Petition

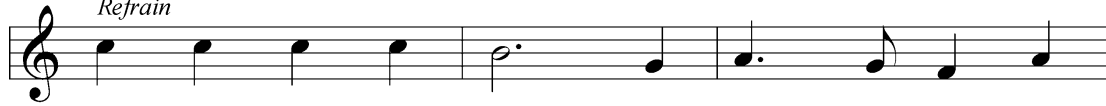
